# A Word from Pr. Joe

What is the Church?

The first weekend in May is always Synod Assembly weekend for the Arkansas-Oklahoma Synod. Ours is one of the earlier ones, along with the Alaska and Rocky Mountain Synods, each year. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is divided into 65 synods, with one of them being nongeographical, that is, it is an ethnic synod with churches in different parts of the country. That synod is the Slovak-Zion Synod. All of this leads me to consider what the church is, where the church is, and how do we all relate to one another.

Properly speaking, according to Article Seven of the Augsburg Confession, "The Church is the assembly of saints in which the gospel is taught purely and the sacraments are administered rightly."

CA VII Concerning the Church. With that view, we see easily how the congregation is the locus of the preaching of the Word and the celebration of the Sacraments. But it is not just there that we find the church. The life of the church is lived out in various ways. Our congregations are gathered in deaneries or clusters. We are gathered in synods. The word "synod" comes from the Greek word σύνοδος meaning "walking the path with each other." That is what we do, really. We are not lone ranger Christians. Some church bodies use other names, such as dioceses, districts, conferences, presbyteries, or consistories. Worldwide, Lutherans tend to stick with synods, districts, or dioceses as the name for their regional groupings. Usually in those church bodies, there is a chief pastor (in our case a bishop) for each of those groups.

We are still part of something even bigger than a synod though! We are part of a national church body, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, formed in 1987 by the merger of three Lutheran church bodies. And we have a semihierarchical structure there as well, with a presiding bishop, church council, and a conference of bishops.

But wait, there's more! The ELCA is part of the Lutheran World Federation, a global communion of Lutheran church bodies. The LWF was founded in Lund. Sweden, in 1947. One of our professors, the late Dr. James Crumley (the last bishop of the Lutheran Church in America prior to the formation of the ELCA) was present as a seminarian at that founding. He recalled that he had no idea just how varied the Lutheran Church was throughout the world. Even what the pastors wore was surprising

to him, coming from a rural congregation in Tennessee.

And finally, of course, we are part of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. We are made members of that Church through holy baptism.

So taking all of that into account, when we gather in synod assembly, we bring the work and vision of our congregations together. We remember that we are part of something so much bigger than we are, and that we are connected to other Lutherans and other Christians throughout the world.

Please join me in praying for our assembly as we travel to Tulsa to worship, to learn, to connect, and to share. And please continue to pray for the whole Church, that we may "all be one," as our Lord Jesus prayed.


## **Summer Sermons**

A heartfelt thank you to those who recently donated to the Norman Coalition For Refugee Support. The money is used in so many different areas to aid our new neighbors to help them adjust to their new lives in safe environments.

In Education, in-home tutoring in English continues. If you would like to join this group, Jeff Coe or Marilyn Brinker can point you in the right direction. Volunteers are needed at summer school for Afghan middle school and high school students, held at First Presbyterian Church in June and July. Hours are from 8:30 to noon, Monday through Thursday. Two volunteers are needed per day. To help with consistency, volunteers are asked to choose one day a week to claim as their own. Volunteer responsibilities will include monitoring student learning, reading to and with students, managing copies/lesson prep and any other task the teacher requests. You will need to have a background check. Marilyn will see if NCRS can help with that. A plan is in place if you have an unexpected scheduling conflict or if you have a planned vacation. Several elementary students have progressed enough in English that they will not need to attend summer school, their reading scores showed proficient growth. All five pre-kindergarten student applicants received all-day program acceptance in their home schools. ELL classes are attended by the adults at First Baptist Church.


Employment opportunities are still being explored and doors are being opened to all eligible. All the Afghan fathers are employed and neighbors from Central and South America are also gainfully employed.

56 neighbors are being directly impacted by the help through Voices For the Voiceless and the Norman Coalition. Of this number, 38 are children through high school age.

The housing committee is looking for houses with four, five or six bedrooms homes. under \$1500, \$1700 and \$2000 respectively per month that accept Section 8 vouchers.

Drivers are needed to drive to drive mothers and their children to doctor and dental appointments while the fathers are at work. Several mothers have received their learner's permit.



# **GREENS**peak Takes on a Unique Format for 5/9!



Please save the date, Thursday, May 9 at 7:00 p.m., for our next GREEN-Speak! Perhaps you've heard of, or have been reading about "AIM Norman." It's a citywide initiative that will help shape the course of Norman over the next two decades. The plan covers a wide spectrum of city planning aspects, including land use, transportation, stormwater management, water infrastructure, wastewater, parks, and housing, all of which have major environmental impacts.

A project manager for the consulting team that's working with the City and the AIM Norman planners, spoke with Amanda Nairn who presented our GREENSpeak program on water management with regard to Lake Thunderbird last year. Amanda suggested that the AIM Norman folks should hold a "<u>listening</u>" session with our GREENSpeak people because it is one group that 1) represents many <u>faith communities</u> in Norman, and 2) we're all concerned about <u>ecological issues</u>. AIM Norman specifically wants input from these 2 groups.

Amy Haase, AICP, the Principal at RDG Planning & Design, Flavia Hauss, a project manager for the consulting team, and a City of Norman representative will be our presenters. After their overview, they'll ask openended questions to gather our responses. If enough people attend, we'll break into 3 small groups for discussion. HAVE YOU ALWAYS WANTED TO EXPRESS YOUR VIEWS ABOUT NORMAN WHEN IT CAN REALLY MAKE A DIFFERENCE? This GREENSpeak is YOUR opportunity! We'll include refreshments and time for fellowship, as always. Please come, bring a friend and offer your input!

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PARTICIPATION with the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Plant Sale! Your generosity provided \$250 +/- for the Densifier Fund. We just did a major overhaul and fixed some problems that happen with excessive use of a small machine. We can actually walk into the Styro-Station again after densifying 21 logs last week. The response at Norman's Earth Day Festival was remarkable! ## **Applying Bible Principles**

When Samuel was seeking someone to succeed Saul as King of Israel, he examined the sons of Jesse. In that process, he considered their stature and physical characteristics in great detail, only to be told by God that people "...look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."

That *modus operandi* on God's part has not changed over the centuries of time. He still looks at the hearts of men and women. He is less interested in how things appear on the outside than what they are really like on the inside. And God's scrutiny extends to every area of our lives, including our giving.

Specifically, He wants to know not just what or when we are giving, but **why**. He is not so concerned about the amount or the percentage but with the reason or motive for our giving. It's not that amounts or percentages are not important, for they certainly are. But what is of greater importance is **why** we give.

If we only give out of a sense of duty, to impress someone, to keep a commitment we made, or to "do our part," we've missed the point. If we only give a certain amount or percentage because we've always given that way, we've missed the point. If we parcel out money to help "poor ol' God pay His bills," we've missed the point.

God owns it all! He doesn't need our money to pay His bills. He doesn't want us to give out of a sense of obligation or duty or habit. Nor does He want us to give to impress someone else. He wants us to give out of hearts motivated by love for Him in response to His love for us. He wants us to give as part of our worship and praise to Him. He wants us to give because giving is part of His way of growing Christians.

There's an old Indian fable about a mouse who, like all mice, was afraid of cats. A wizard felt sorry for him and offered to help him lose his fear. With the mouse's approval, the wizard turned him into a cat. The cat, however, was afraid of dogs, so the wizard turned the cat into a dog. But the dog was afraid of tigers, so the wizard turned the dog into a tiger. When the wizard discovered the tiger was afraid of hunters, he exclaimed in disgust, "You're hopeless. What you need is a change of heart. And that I cannot give you."

If our giving is motivated by anything other than a heart of love for God, we need a change of heart. We need to realize afresh that God owns everything and that we are just managers and stewards. We need to realize that when we give, we are only giving back to God what was rightfully His in the first place. And we need to understand that when we give out of love for God and not out of habit or duty or obligation, we are giving in a way that truly honors and glorifies Him.

### Altar Guild in Need of New Members




